She served as president of the New York State Association for Bilingual Education and was a Fulbright scholar in Oaxaca, Mexico. Tatyana has authored books and articles on immigration, translanguaging, and bilingual education. Her forthcoming book is titled *Living, Learning and Languageing Across Borders: Students Between the US and Mexico*. Tatyana's work in film as a producer and director includes the *Living Undocumented Series*, *Una Vida, Dos Paises: Children and Youth (Back) in Mexico* and the *Supporting Immigrants in Schools* video series. Tatyana was an elementary school teacher in San Pedro Sula, Honduras and Atlanta, Georgia.



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
